## 2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organises special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Desh Bhagat University organizes orientation program for the students at the commencement of every academic year. During the course of orientation, a faculty mentor is assigned to every student for regular counseling/mentoring. Advanced and slow learners are identified based on their involvement in the classroom and their performance in continuous assessments through MST, assignments, quizzes and other evaluation components. Students, who repeatedly score marks below 50%, are categorized as slow learners and those scoring above 80% are categorized as advanced learners.

**Common Strategies for both Advanced/ Slow Learners:** The University has devised strategies to incorporate peer learning and evaluation in many courses—especially for the project and collaborative assessments. Many guest lectures, workshops, seminars, presentations are embedded in the pedagogy. The Research Cell and IEDC, also mentor them by providing internship opportunities besides their regular academic assignments. Special attention and help to Slow Learners: Slow learners are given extra flexibility and time to improve their performance. The course teachers help them by providing help notes, question banks, PPTs and strategies for time management. Remedial classes are held for students by organizing classes so as to improve academic aspects of the student's.

### 2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Depending upon the program, various student-centric approaches such as group discussions, case study analyses, role-plays, experiential exercises, seminars, presentations, design/live projects, industry internships and field activities are adopted and promulgated

Numerous student chapters of reputed organizations like IEEE (Student section) is available that provide the students an international flavor of professionalism. IEDC has established an on campus incubator and is an excellent place for students for learning-by-doing. The journey from 'Idea to Implementation' is filled with experience for the participants. Numerous clubs offer the students a chance to schedule organize and manage events relevant to their areas of interest and specialization. Students are encouraged to participate in interuniversity competitions, entrepreneurship awareness camps and other business events to widen their technical knowledge and strengthen the learning experience. Students conduct several activities in the five villages adopted by the University to align their learning in the classroom with that in the working world. Several social projects are taken by NSS unit to make students feel and implement what they learn in their classrooms. School of Ayurveda , Dental , Nursing are actively involved and contributing towards health of the society

### 2.3.2 - Teachers use ICT enabled tools including online resources for effective teaching and learning processes during the year

ICT enabled teaching includes class rooms with LCD/LED, Wi-Fi, projectors, computers/laptops, smart boards, language lab, e-learning resources, video competence etc for effective teaching and learning. University regularly conducts workshops on ICT tools for all faculties for improvement in effective teaching and learning process. University also conducts regular sessions to develop behavioral and communication skills among the students.

The faculties uses various ICT enabled tools to enhance the quality of teaching-learning like as

- Google Class Rooms help to faculty easily manage and deliver performance assessments such as learning material, quizzes, assignments etc.
- The use of virtual labs facilitated by IITs to creating multiple students accounts and conducts labs through online simulations.
- The PPTs enabled teaching with animations and simulations to improve the effectiveness of the teaching learning process.
- Media lab is used to create video lectures and upload in ERP platform for students.
- For mathematical subjects in online mode, faculties are using online tools like Jamboard in Google meet etc.
- Faculties are also using e-learning content for teaching & learning such as NPTEL, SWAYAM courses, MOOCs, e-books through digital library. DBU has developed online video contents of courses in different discipline.

2.5.3 - IT integration and reforms in the examination procedures and processes (continuous internal assessment and end-semester assessment) have brought in considerable improvement in examination management system of the institution

Desh Bhagat University is IT-centric examination system is advanced and highly secured to meet the requirement of students and all stakeholders. This automation is done through centralized ERP. During the current COVID-19 crisis, majority of the exams are being conducted online through Hiremee software. This has been possible because the faculty members and the students were already trained to use these online platforms.

Crucial tasks like, preparing examination seating plan, roastering Faculty for invigilation, assigning the secrecy codes on the answer sheets, data-entry of internal and external marks, evaluating and

assigning grades, conducting the course-wise and program-wise detailed analysis of the results are managed through ERP.

The generation of admit cards, grade cards, degree certificates, transcripts, backlog certificates, University gazette notifications, etc. have also been automated so that confidentiality is never compromised. SMS alerts are sent to parents of the students as soon as the results of a particular semester are declared. Online payment gateway was extended for applying for re-appear examinations, obtaining degree certificate & other credentials.

The University has a tie-up with National Academic Depository (NAD) portal to provide online verification of degree certificates and also conducts an competitive exams on the request of Govt and recognized agencies.

## 2.6 - Student Performance and Learning Outcomes

The learning outcome is critically evaluated by the stakeholders through examinations, assignments, evaluation, placement record, employer survey and feedback of passing out students. The IQAC conduct coherent assessment of the learning outcome to monitor and ensure the quality and consistent academic progression.

**Methodology :**

**Step1:** To certify that all POs & PSOs & COs are taken care of and enfolded in the curricula, primarily through the courses of the program.

**Step 2:** Course coordinators evaluate course outcomes by direct (exam) & indirect methods (Alumni Survey, Employer Survey and Feedback of Parents etc.)

**Step 3:** Average of outcomes of all course mapped to PO is considered for PO Attainment. If the average of all the courses in a semester attains the performance criterion in specific PO, then that PO is regarded as attained by the end of semester. PSOs are also evaluated in the same manner.

**Step 4: Assessment of indirect program outcomes is based on surveys like Alumni Survey, Employer Survey and Feedback of Parents etc.**

Desh Bhagat University is a self-financed University and the main source of revenue is fees collected from the students and donations collected from various sources u/s 80G. University receives extra mural funding from Govt. as well as Non-Govt. recourses. The funds are allocated and utilized in meticulously planned manner for the

benefit of the students, the qualitative improvement in infrastructure, extension activities, and extracurricular activities and to develop infrastructure for technological innovation. We follow SOPs of waste management (collection, transportation, pre-treatment, recycling/recovery, disposal). This strategy helps in improving the overall sustainability of the campus. Solid biodegradable waste from gardens, hostels, canteens used at Vermi compost unit for compost used at fields to uplift soil nutrition organically and Biogas plant at boy's hostel to produce biogas used in mess. The University has signed MoU with piggery Farm house.

Liquid waste management 3 STP of 600KLD capacity installed to cater 200 m<sup>3</sup> waste water generated/ day. The sewage is treated aerobically and is used for irrigation. In addition Root Zone Technology is also implemented as pilot project for water treatment. Sprinklers are

used to reduce water wastage in the fields. Rain water harvesting structures constructed .

**E waste management:** Optimized by inventory of computers through reassembling, modification and up gradation. The parts of outdated equipment are used for repairing usable machines. For disposable e material, according to guidelines of Punjab Pollution Control Board, the University has signed MoU with a company who collect the e- waste.

**Biomedical waste management:** MoU is signed with Rainbow Environment Pvt. Ltd. Mohali to facilitate treatment of biomedical waste by segregating biomedical waste according to the color code and label system.

incubation policy of university and has provided subsidy to women to motivate them for opting for their startup. As a result we have pre incubated 2 women driven startup.

University provides opportunity to women who can barely read and write to get trained to become skilled professionals. The research project funded by DST, Entitled, "Development of Women Business Park for Empowerment of Rural Women in selected Villages of Fatehgarh Sahib, Punjab using Eco-Friendly Innovations" focuses on making sanitary napkins, disposable plates, phulkari digital design. We are also working on providing skill to women in field of textile, food processing and IT. University provides Shakti Scholarship to girl candidate in order to motivate and promote education among them. Till date university has provided around 50 lac Shakti scholarship to eligible candidates

### 7.3.2 - Plan of action for the next academic year

The founders of the university visualized it as a center to empower women as better homemakers and thus to perform effectively in the process of nation-building.

- To organize more varied academic, technical, medical, cultural and social events for the upliftment of women and spread the real importance of gender equality in the society through students and faculty.
- Identification of strong leadership, change-makers among women and girls and building their capacity by Career Guidance & Placement Cell.
- The Women Grievance Cell to provide enhanced opportunities and programs for girls and women to be financially, mentally and emotionally empowered to promote their growth as individuals in their own right.
- IEDC Incubation cell work on skill development to impart knowledge of opportunities and tools available and train the women. Provide subsidy under incubation policy to inculcate entrepreneurial attitude among young girls, scientists at the earliest so that they can be "job providers" rather than "job seekers".
- Faculty of legal studies to establish law cell for Counselling services for resident and non - resident student
- Research Promotion Cell; inculcate research culture and aptitude amongst the women students and teachers with an aim to empower them.
